

Former Regulators Offer Training Seminars for Bank Directors

Texas banks will have two opportunities to send their board members to one-day seminars being presented by a team of former regulators.

Cathy Ghiglieri, a former Texas bank commissioner, and Jewell D. Hoover, who worked at the Office of the Comptroller of Currency for nearly three decades, have established a Bank Directors College that will offer courses covering such issues as the responsibility of committees, the Sarbanes-Oxley Act, management information systems, risk management, and how to spot red flags.

"The need for this particular caliber of training program is becoming more and more evident," Ms. Ghiglieri said in a press release. "De novo bank directors are being encouraged and, in some cases, required by regulators to attend training classes."

The sessions are scheduled for Oct. 9 in Austin and Nov. 29 in Dallas.

The college also will conduct seminars Oct. 11 in Atlanta and Oct. 17 in Orlando.

In addition to overseeing the Texas Department of Banking for six years, Ms. Ghiglieri worked for the OCC for 18 years.

Ms. Hoover is a former deputy comptroller for the OCC's Western District.
